# Narrative Report First Quarter Report: January to March 2015 CPCDO in Battambong

# 1. Background

Children and Poor Community Development Organization (CPCDO) branch is located in Battambang (BTT), Cambodia which received funding support from the Float Foundation since January 2007. The funds from the Float Foundation were used to construct three buildings to house 50 orphanages (26/boys and 24/girls), four toilets, and a small room for generator. One of the three buildings is used for a study room/dining area. In addition, the office is also located in this building. The fund was also used to construct an outdoor kitchen which is connected to the girls' building. The Center started its full operation as of April 20, 2007.

This report is covered period from January to March 2015 which is the 9<sup>th</sup> year project which has been funded by the Float Foundation.

# 2. <u>CPCDO Personnel</u>

There were 5 staffs working for the BTT-CPCDO branch in the following positions:

- Shelter Director (Male)
- Admin and Finance (Female)
- Teacher (female)
- Cook, (Female)

As routine, staff meeting was regularly held every month. In each meeting, regular agenda were discussed: managing children, teaching and educating children on moral and rules living in the center, security and order in the center and hygiene foods and health.

Staff had regular visit to children' schools to monitor and had talked with teachers to find out more about their behavior.

## 3. Children Status:

During this reporting period, there were 37 children living in the center whose ages are from 6 years old to 19 years old and 17 of them are girl. Among them 4 children are orphan no parents, 8 of them have no father, 3 have no mother, 21 children were from very poor families and 1 child was abandoned.

All children are studying at public school from grad 1 to 10 except one girl did not study due to her mental health. There are 21 children studying at primary school, 8 children are at junior high school and 5 children are at high school. One boy is at skills training, tailoring skills.

## a. Program at the Center:

The English program was been running by Ms. Nong, teacher, and also conducted by elder children to the youngers in the evening. For elder children, they had studied English at their school and also at the church near-by the center.

## Life Skills Program

This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> year of life skills program running under support from Rotary Clubs. However, during this reporting period the program was run in a small size with low budget.

## Drawing

During this reporting period, 24 children were taking drawing class every Sunday.

#### Computer

There are 3 computers in the center which children can use based on their need and assignment from school. The training was stop because children were provided this kind of training at their school.

## <u>Agriculture</u>

It is regular activity of children and staff that they had growth some vegetable to supplement to their daily food bought from the local market.

Last year in October, a big chicken cage, 5m x 7m was built to growth chickens and ducks. Unfortunately all chicken and duck were killed by illness of chicken within 3-4 days in late of year. However, they would continue this project based on the available fund.

## Meals

Each child received three meals per day, breakfast, lunch and dinner which all eat together.

## b. Children health and hygiene:

It is a regular and set program for children living in the center to rotate in cleaning up the buildings and surrounded premise. They were trained to put garbage in a proper bin as well as to make sure the center is a plastic free which means that no plastic bag flying around the premise.

Although a few young children were difficult in keeping themselves clean but all children had been taking good care of themselves and their younger brothers and sisters. During this reporting period due to the change of weather, children had light illness such as cool, and headache.

AEC had continued providing health care sponsorship to children. A nurse regularly came to the center once every two weeks to check children health and he would treat children with

light illness. With this regular visit of the nurse it helped CPCDO in children health and hygiene.

## c. Children Materials:

During this reporting period there were only 17 bicycles in good condition and 6 of them were broken which can not be used. The management had managed to have theses bicycles fixed it monthly.

## d. Children Facility:

With the support from the Float Foundation and Rotary Clubs (Canada, Bangkok South and Madenea), children were provided more comfortable rooms where a bathroom was in the room.

A renovated kitchen and a connected pam house which were funded by by Rotary Club Canada was started in mid February and exspected to be completed by end of March.

## 4. Vegetable garden and tree

3-4 different kinds of vegetable were growth regularly for their daily food and also some fruit tree such as banana, mongo and jack fruits were also plan.

## 5. Library

The small library had continued its function serving both children in the center and the community. There were 257 books in the library.

#### 6. Other event/ Activity:

- In March, there was a visit of a President and a representative of the Float Foundation together with Rotary clubs, Bangkok South and Canada to the center to see the progress of children, their needs and also the progress of kitchen renovation project.
- A visit of Cambodia American people to the center and they had brought some food for children.

## Difficulty:

• Difficult to find co financial support for the operation in 2015

#### Further Plan

- Continue coaching children on how take care themselves and their belongings.
- Seek fund from other resources, especially local business people.

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
