Narrative Report January- March 2016 CPCDO in Battambong

1. Background

Children and Poor Community Development Organization (CPCDO) branch is located in Battambang (BTT), Cambodia which received funding support from the Float Foundation since January 2007. The funds from the Float Foundation were used to construct three buildings to house 50 orphanages (26/boys and 24/girls), four toilets, and a small room for generator. One of the three buildings is used for a study room/dining area. In addition, the office is also located in this building. The fund was also used to construct an outdoor kitchen which is connected to the girls' building. The Center started its full operation as of April 20, 2007.

This report is covered period from January to March 2016 which is the 10th year project which has been funded by the Float Foundation.

2. <u>CPCDO Personnel</u>

There were 4 staffs working for the BTT-CPCDO branch in the following positions:

- Shelter Director (Female)
- Admin and Finance (Female)
- Teacher (Male)
- Cook, (Female)

Regular meeting with all staff was held monthly to discuss: management of children, teaching and educating children on moral and rules living in the center, security and order in the center and hygiene foods and health.

Staff had regular visit to children' schools to monitor and had talked with teachers to find out more about their behavior.

3. Children Status:

From the begging of the year, there were 37 children living in the center whose ages are from 6 years old to 19 years old and 17 of them are girl. Among them 5 children are orphan no parents, 7 of them have no father, 3 have no mother, 21 children were from very poor families and 1 child, girl, was abandoned.

All children are studying at public school from grad 1 to 11 except one girl did not study due to her mental health. There are 22 children studying at primary school, 5 children are at junior high school and 7 children are at high school. Children who are studying at high school stay whole day at the school due to the distance from the center and school and daily class schedule.

a. Program at the Center:

The English program was continued by Ms. Nong from Monday to Friday and also conducted by elder children to the youngers in the evening. For elder children, they had studied English at their school and also at the church near-by the center.

To supplement to their daily food bought from the local market, children and staff had growth some vegetable as part of their daily activity in the center.

Meals

Each child received three meals per day, breakfast, lunch and dinner which all eat together.

b. Children health and hygiene:

It is a regular and set program for children living in the center to help cleaning up the buildings and surrounded premise and ensure clean and good environment for living. They were trained to put garbage in a proper bin as well as to make sure the center is a plastic free which means that no plastic bag flying around the premise.

Elder children do not only take care themselves but also help their guardian, CPCDO staff, looking after younger children too. During this reporting period due to the change of weather, children had light illness such as cool, and headache.

It has been good support in taking care of children health and hygiene, that AEC has continued providing health care sponsorship to children. A nurse regularly came to the center once every two weeks to check children health and he would treat children with light illness.

c. Children Materials:

There are 23 bicycles in good condition. The management had managed to have theses bicycles fixed it monthly.

d. Children Facility:

With the support from the Float Foundation and Rotary Clubs (Canada, Bangkok South and Madenea), children were provided more comfortable rooms where a bathroom was in the room. The girl building was renovated in 2014 which each room has its own bathroom and there are 3 rooms in the girl building.

As plan the Float Foundation has raised sufficient fund to renovate the boy building in which the project will start after Khmer New Year (April).

As part of this year plan, pure drinking water filter was stated and developped under the support from Rotary Club of South Surrey, Canada.

4. Vegetable garden and tree

As part of daily activity, children are taking care in growing 3-4 different kinds of vegetable and also some fruit tree such as banana, mongo, jack fruits and dragon fruits. Children had enjoyed some fruits such banana, and jack fruits and soon mango.

In order for children to have better space for daily activities and a bigger area for cultivation, a spot of land behind the study building was refilled in late March with support from Rotary Club of South Surrey, Canada.



5. Library

March 2016

The small library had continued its function serving both children in the center and the community. There were 257 books in the library. Staff and children had rearranged the books, game, and toys in the library.

Further Plan

- Continue coaching children on how take care themselves and their belongings.
- Seek fund from other resources, especially local business people.

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
